

The windiest month of the year in Cook Islands is September, with an average hourly wind speed of 14.2 miles per hour. The calmer time of year lasts for 7.0 months, from November 2 to June 1 . The calmest month of the year in Cook Islands is March, with an average hourly wind speed of 13.0 miles per hour .

October is the beginning of the warm and wet season in the Cook Islands. The average temperature is around 23°C (73°F), with highs of 25.4°C (78°F) and lows of 21.1°C (70°F). It is a transitional month, so temperatures can still reach up to 30°C (86°F) on some days. There is an average of 4.91 inches of precipitation during October, with a 32.3% chance of ...

There is a 41.9% chance of rain each day, and it will have a 3.0% impact on the ability to perform outdoor activities. The best time for windsurfing in the Cook Islands is during the trade wind season between May and October, with the best month being August. With steady low-pressure systems on the tropical belt, however, windsurfing can be enjoyed all year round in the Cook Islands with predominantly easterly trade winds ranging from 15 to 30 knots.

In May, the Cook Islands experience warm and sunny weather, with an average temperature of 24.2°C (75.6°F). Daily highs reach an average of 26.5°C (79.6°F), while nighttime lows dip down to an average of 21.7°C (71.1°F). Travelers visiting the Cook Islands in May can expect a moderate amount of rainfall, with an average precipitation of 2.42mm (0.1 inches) ...
